Proposals for interactive workshops and panels related to teaching and learning philosophy at any educational level are welcome. Applicants are welcome to submit more than one proposal. We especially encourage workshops and panels on the following topics:

- innovative & successful teaching strategies
- professional issues connected to teaching
- how work in other disciplines can improve the teaching of philosophy
- engaging students outside the classroom
- innovative uses of instructional technologies
- the challenge of teaching in new settings
- methods to improve student learning

PROPOSAL GUIDELINES

- **Deadline extended:** submissions **must** be received by **February 1, 2010.**
- Each Submission should consist of two separate files: the Proposal and the Cover Sheet. The Proposal should include (a) the session title, (b) a 1-3 page description of what the presentation will cover, what participants will do during the session, and what the session seeks to achieve, (c) a list of references, especially to relevant pedagogical literature, (d) any handouts to be provided, and (e) a list of equipment needed. To facilitate the blind review process, no identifying information should appear in the Proposal.
- The Cover Sheet should include (a) the session title, (b) a 100-200 word abstract for use in the printed conference program, (c) each presenter's name, institutional affiliation (if any), and contact information, (d) the length of the presentation (60 or 90 minutes), (e) the format of the presentation (workshop, panel, discussion, or demonstration), and (f) a list of equipment needed.
- Submissions must be via email. Send Submissions to Andrew Mills at amills@otterbein.edu with "AAPT Proposal" in the subject line of your message. Attachments must be in MS Word (.doc or .docx) or PDF (.pdf) format and should be labeled with your name (e.g., Jane_Doe_Proposal.doc and Jane_Doe_Cover_Sheet.doc). Use numbers for multiple Submissions.
